<u>Literacy</u>:

We love to read in Primary 3! We will continue to focus on developing our fluency and expression when reading aloud, scanning the text for key words. We will also keep working on our comprehension skills by answering a variety of comprehension questions focusing on answering in full sentences.

We will be reading Fiction and Non Fiction books about 'Toys' and completing a variety of activities related to them.

Our grammar focus will be nouns, verbs and adjectives. We will also be revising when to use capital letters and full stops in sentences.

The genre we will be focusing on when writing is <u>'Narrative'</u>. We will write some lovely creative stories about toys and we will also write about our favourite toy! Encourage your child to talk about what they are going to write first - does each sentence make sense? It is important to encourage independent writing using sounds but do provide as much support as needed to increase confidence in writing.

Numeracy:

We will continue to look at the 100 square and find patterns. We will be learning all about tens and units and we will understand that every place has a value! **3D Shape** - We will be learning the names of regular 3D shapes and discussing their properties (faces, edges and corners).

We will also be developing our Mental Maths skills especially our knowledge of number stories within 20. Keep practicing quick recall at home!

We will keep working on our Problem Solving Skills. Mrs Fleming said we are brilliant problem solvers in Primary 3! Remember to keep using the <u>Mathletics</u> programme at home too!
