Looking back... Sporting News St Josephs' Swim Team

St Joseph's Swimmers were in action again at the Swim Ulster Schools' Championships on 15<sup>th</sup> October in the Bangor Aurora Centre, competing against over 200 of the best swimmers from schools all across Ulster. Our P7 swimmers Rihanna Lawlor and Moya O'Kane competed in 2 events each and made the finals in both. Rihanna finished in a fine 5<sup>th</sup> place in the 50 metre Butterfly and went one place better in the 50 metre Freestyle, finishing 4<sup>th</sup> - less than half a second behind third. Moya swam in the 100 metre Individual Medley - where the swimmers compete in all 4 strokes (butterfly, backstroke, breaststroke and freestyle) over 4 lengths and the 50 metre backstroke. Moya made the final in both her events winning the IM by a clear margin (over 3 seconds). The backstroke was a much closer race but again Moya came away with 1<sup>st</sup> place. This time the gap was .01 of a second! Well done girls – this is a great reward for all your hard work in the pool!

Together they looked at planning for learning in the Foundation Stage as well as observations and assessment. The teachers were really enthused about the day and are beginning to implement her recommendations into classroom practice.

Fiona from 'Road of Hope' came to school yesterday to collect them and she was really pleased. She says a massive thank you to all of you.
