Welcome to Primary 4

During this year P4 will be covering a number of learning areas as well as developing key skills and capabilities in line with the revised curriculum.

This learning plan provides you with an overview of the learning areas and the skills and capabilities to be developed throughout P4.



At the end of the year you will receive your child's Annual Pupil Profile. This profile will report on your child's achievements within these learning areas and skills and capabilities as well as providing you with information on their attitudes and interests within school. The pupil profile will also provide you with information on possible areas of development for your child.

Literacy

Throughout the year pupils will be given the opportunity to develop the following areas using a wide range of fiction and non-fiction texts:

Reading

- Explore their own preferences in reading material, and talk about their choices.
- Use a wide range of decoding skills independently.
- Identify with characters' feelings and experiences in a range of texts.
- Read silently with independence and show signs of their own reading habits.
- Develop their understanding of what they have read by completing a variety of comprehension activities, answering in full sentences.

<u>Writing</u>

- Understand the range of writing forms with guidance.
- Express a range of thoughts and feelings and will begin to write imaginatively with limited support.
- Spell common words recognisably and will begin to use strategies to spell irregular words.
- <u>Free Writing -</u> children will be given opportunities to write creatively in order to improve their writing style, improve vocabulary and see themselves as writers.



Numeracy

Throughout the year, pupils will be able to explore and develop confidence in the following areas through mental, practical and written tasks.

Using Mathematics

- Select, with help from the teacher materials and equipment that need to be used for tasks
- Discuss possible approaches to solving a problem with guidance from the teacher.
- Use an increasing range of mathematical language to ask questions or to explain their thinking about tasks.
- Work in pairs and small groups to carry out tasks and solve problems.
- Develop their mathematical knowledge of mathematical language to help them solve problems.
